**When an Additional rule is preceded by “WAR”, the rule should be viewed in conjunction with the Waterski Additional rules.**

**When an Additional rule is preceded by “DEA”, it does not exist in the IWWF Disabled Rules and the rule does not refers to the Waterski Additional rules.**

**When an Additional rule is NOT preceded by WAR or DEA, the rule does exist in the IWWF Disabled Rules and should be viewed in conjunction with the IWWF Disabled rule.**

## SECTION 1 - GENERAL RULES

These rules supersede all previous editions and addenda and shall remain in effect until an amended edition of the rules is published. These rules have been drafted in English. In the case of conflicting interpretation, only the English text shall be considered authentic. ### Rule 1 – General

#### a) Reference

Where the words “World” or “IWWF” appear, these are to be read as “Confederation Europe & Africa”. Where the word “Confederations” appears, it is to be read as “Federation” or “Federations”. Rule numbers starting with a number or starting with the letters DAR refer to this **April 2022** issue of the Europe & Africa IWWF Additional Rules Water Ski for the Disabled. Rule numbers starting with a D refer to the most recent publication of the IWWF Technical Rules for Water Ski for the Disabled. Rule numbers starting with a W refer to the most recent publication of the IWWF Water Ski Rules. Rule numbers starting with the letters WAR refer to the most recent publication of the IWWF European (Europe & Africa) Additional Rules.

#### General principle

The rules for disabled water skiing applied to all homologated competitions in Europe & Africa of the IWWF shall follow the most recent publication of the IWWF Technical Rules for Water Ski for the Disabled, except as modified by these Europe & Africa IWWF Additional Rules Water Ski for the Disabled.

#### General Europe & Africa regulations

These Europe & Africa IWWF Additional Rules Water Ski for the Disabled are supplementary to the general Europe & Africa regulations consisting of the Statutes, the Bye-Laws and the List of Obligations.

In case of conflict between a regulation in these Additional Rules and a general Europe & Africa regulation, the latter shall apply.

#### Specific Rules

All WAR rules are applicable with the exceptions:

- Rule WAR SECTION 3 – Rule 14.07 Familiarisation
- Rule WAR SECTION 3 – Rule 14.18 Ranking list to be used
- Rule WAR SECTION 3 – Rule 15, Rule 16, Rule 17 and Rule 18
- Rule WAR SECTION 4 – Rule EA4.2 Mediterranean Games
- Rule WAR SECTION 4 – Rule EA4.3 Mediterranean Beach Games
- Rule WAR SECTION 4 – Rule EA4.5 Medals and Titles
- Rule WAR SECTION 5 – EA5.2

- b) The organisers of homologated competitions in Europe & Africa, other than those titled competitions where specific Additional Rules apply, may make variations from those rules that do not affect the recorded scores of the competitors or the homologation of the competition. Examples of acceptable variations are those to administrative matters, entry requirements, familiarisation, method of draw, number of events or rounds, numbers in finals, slalom start speeds, method of determining event placement and/or overall and

Team placement. The organising Federation is responsible for notifying the D.C. of significant variations which could affect the acceptability of the competition for the Europe & Africa Calendar or the homologation of the competition. The D.C. is the sole arbiter as to whether any variations are acceptable.

**1.03: Amendments to the rules**

This rule will replace D1.03

The Europe & Africa Disabled Council (D.C.) may make amendments to these rules at any time and decide on which date these will become effective.

## SECTION 3 – EUROPE AND AFRICA CHAMPIONSHIPS RULES

### Rule 14 – E&A Championships Administration rules.

#### General

The format of the Europe & Africa Championships shall follow that of the World Championships except where otherwise stated below or elsewhere in these Additional Rules.

Where the words "World" or "IWWF" appear, these are to be read as "Confederation Europe & Africa". Where the words "Confederation" or "Confederations" appear, these are to be read as "Federation" or "Federations".

Recommended schedule for E&A C – see appendix F

#### 14.01: Frequency of Competition

Rule D14.01 is replaced by:

The E&A Open Disabled Championships shall be held biennially in even numbered years.

#### 14.04: Chief Judge and Appointed Officials

The Bureau of Europe & Africa shall appoint the following officials after receiving proposals from the D.C.: a Chief Judge, an Assistant Chief Judge, 5 Judges, a Homologator, a Scorer, 2 Drivers, and a Multi Plegics Classification Team consisting of three people, one of them will be the Chief Classification Officer.

#### 14.05: Event Judges

The Event Judges for each event shall be chosen by the Chief Judge from among the Appointed Judges. As far as possible, the Event Judges shall be from different Federations.

#### 14.07: Official familiarisation

Familiarisation shall be offered in all events. In exceptional circumstances the offer of familiarisations may not be available.

#### 14.08: Rounds

Each event shall consist of two rounds: a preliminary round and a final round.

All skiers qualified to ski in an event must ski in the preliminary round of that event.

The number of skiers qualified to ski in the Final round of an event shall be as shown in the following table and will be announced immediately after the end of the Preliminary round of the event:

Number of skiers entered and paid in Preliminary round	Number of skiers in Finals
1 – 5	All
6 – 10	first 5
11 – 12	first 6
13 – 15	first 8
16 – 19	first 10
20 and more	first 12

However, skiers with a score of zero (0) in the preliminary round shall not be entitled to ski in the final round.

In the case of a tie for any position which may result in more than the prescribed number of skiers going through to the final round there will be a run off between the tied skiers so that only the prescribed number of skiers go into the finals.

#### 14.09: Europe and Africa Championships entry and administration

Rule D14.09 applies with the following addition:

Registration procedure must be set up and operated by the organiser under the supervision of the Chief Judge. Teams should check in at the earliest possible moment after their arrival. Registration must be completed by 12:00 (noon) the day before the start of the preliminary round. If a skier chooses to ski in familiarisation, registration must be completed before the start of familiarisation.

### Rule 15 – E&A Open Championships entry

#### 15.01: Team selection

Rule D15.01 will apply.

#### 15.02: Entry requirements

a) Event qualification

Must have proof of a score in each event they wish to enter.

b) Team qualification for the organising federation

If the team of the organising federation has six skiers or less, they do not need to be qualified as per DAR15.02.a) to enter an event.

If the team of the organising federation has seven to 14 skiers, team members need to be qualified as per DAR15.02.a) for each entered event except that one single skier may enter one or more events (for which he is not qualified) of his category if both the following conditions are met:

There is no other skier (man or woman) in the team in this category.

The skier does not appear in any category in any event on the Europe & Africa Ranking List for the current year or the two previous years.

c) Team qualification for other federations

Members of a team of one or two skiers do not need to be qualified as per DAR15.02.a) to enter an event.

Members of a team of three to 14 skiers need to be qualified as per DAR15.02.a) for each entered event except that one single skier may enter one or more events (for which he is not qualified) of his category if both the following conditions are met:

There is no other skier (man or woman) in the team in this category; The skier does not appear in any category in any event on the Europe & Africa Ranking List for the current year or the two previous years.

d) Jump safety requirement.

Notwithstanding DAR15.01, DAR15.02.b) and DAR15.02.c) in order to enter the jump event a skier must prove that he has successfully landed a jump.

### Rule 16 - Medals, event scoring, overall, team competition

#### 16.01: Event scoring

Preliminary and final rounds in each event shall be run in three divisions with men and women separated (D2.04). Each competitor shall be awarded, in each event, a certain number of points according to the relationship of his score to the Europe & Africa record.



Points will be calculated as follows:

$$\frac{\text{Skiers score} \times 1000}{\text{Europe \& Africa record}}$$

#### 16.05: Team overall

D16.05 will be replaced by: "Team overall placement is based on the overall points obtained by skiers who are official members of a Federation team. The four best overall scores, men or women, from any category, in each event, i.e., a total of 12 scores, shall be summed up to obtain the team overall placement. For this purpose, any individual score exceeding 1,200 points shall be reduced to 1,200 points."

#### 16.06: Medals and Titles

##### a) General

Europe & Africa titles and medals will be distributed under the responsibility of the President of Europe & Africa Disabled Council for the following competitions:  
Europe & Africa Championships.

##### b) Europe & Africa Championships

Medals for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place will be awarded in all 3 events and overall in the divisions of seated, standing and vision impaired for men and women.  
For team overall, a maximum of 15 gold, 15 silver, 15 bronze

##### c) Medals For the Officials:

1 gold	Chief Judge
1 gold	Assistant Chief Judge
1 gold	Homologator
1 gold	Scorer
1 gold	Chief Classification Officer
5 gold	Judges
2 gold	Drivers
3 gold	MP Classification Team
Maximum of 5 gold	Organisers

##### d) Restrictions regarding award of medals and titles

If there are 3 skiers or less in a division's event, medals will only be awarded if the overall points achieved are equal to or greater than 500 points in any round of the related event. If the 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> place skier is awarded a medal, all higher placed skiers shall also receive a medal.

### Rule 17 - Classification requirements

#### a) MP5, A1, A2, L and LP

Skiers classified at the World or E&A Championships in their respective category will not have to be reclassified except that:

- The Classification Team from previous World or E&A Championships may request to the Chief Judge and Chief Classification Officer that the skier be reclassified.
- The Classification Team may request to the Chief Judge and Chief Classification Officer that the skier be reclassified.
- Team Captain/Federation representative of skier may request reclassification – this request must be submitted at least 7 days prior to the Championships and must be

accompanied by medical information on an additional permanent disability that is not related to the normal ageing process, which could justify reclassification.

- Prior to classification, the Team Captain/Federation representative of any competing Federation other than the Team Captain/Federation representative of the skier may request reclassification of any MP5, A1, A2, L or LP skier. This must be in writing prior to classification, stating the reason for the request, and be accompanied by 200 Euros. The fee will not be refunded if the Chief Classification Officer does not consider the reason justifiable, or the classification of the athlete does not change.

*b) MP1, MP2, MP3, MP4, A/L1, A/L2, V1, V2 & V3*

Skiers classified at two World and/or E&A Championships in their respective category will not have to be reclassified except as outlined above.

After the competition, the Chief Classification Officer shall provide the Europe & Africa Disabled Council with a detailed report on classification operations. This will include the basis for each classification decision and the results of all tests performed on site.

The categories of the skiers will be posted on the E&A and IWWF disabled websites.

## SECTION 4 – MISCELLANEOUS RULES

### Rule 18 – Records

- a) World Records – Rule D18 will apply.  
Europe & Africa Records – Rule D18 will apply.  
No performance will be accepted as a E&A Record unless it equals or exceeds the minima in Appendix B of these Europe & Africa Additional Rules.
- b) A performance by a Europe & Africa skier which has been approved by the World Disabled Council as a World Record, will be recognised by the DC as an Europe & Africa Record.

### Rule WAR 24 - Ranking List

#### WAR24.01: General

The Europe & Africa Ranking Lists are published every year by the Disabled Council. The best eligible result of each skier in each event is considered for the lists.

#### WAR24.02: Performances eligible for inclusion

The Europe & Africa Ranking List is prepared from the performances recorded in the published results of Ranking list and record capable homologated competitions, which have been received within the time specified below by Europe & Africa. Only performances from 1<sup>st</sup> November of the previous year to 31<sup>st</sup> October of the current year will be considered for inclusion.  
Where a performance is approved as a Europe & Africa Record, this value will be included in the Ranking List using the score approved by the D.C. as the record.  
If upon reviewing the performance, the record is reduced to a score below the current Europe & Africa Record, or if a performance from a Ranking List competition equals or exceeds the Europe & Africa Record, the score will be limited to the maximums shown below:  
Slalom: Europe & Africa record minus ½ buoy  
Tricks: Europe & Africa record minus 10 points  
Jump: Europe & Africa record minus 0.10m

#### WAR24.04: Events

Only the first sentence of WAR 24.2 will apply

#### WAR24.04: Closing dates

The closing date for the receipt of all the information required is the 15<sup>th</sup> October of the year in question, or seven days after the date of the competition, whichever is the later. Provisional lists will be published by the 1<sup>st</sup> December. The final date for notification of corrections is 30<sup>th</sup> December and the final lists will be published by January 30<sup>th</sup> of the following year.

### Rule DEA1 - Homologation Of Competitions

#### DEA1.01: Types of Homologation

There are two types of homologation:

- Ranking List homologation
- Record Capability homologation

Whenever an applicable Waterski Additional Rule refers to Normal homologation, it is replaced with Ranking List homologation. Whenever an applicable Waterski Additional Rule refers to Ranking List homologation, it is replaced with Record Capability homologation.

Rule WAR 25 will apply except for 25.01b) and 25.04

#### DEA1.02: Ranking List Homologation

##### a) Qualification of the officials

To be recognised as a Ranking List homologated competition, the jury must, as a minimum, consist of:

- Chief Judge: J2D or J2  
If the Chief judge is a J2, it is sufficient to appoint J2D as Assistant Chief Judge.

- Homologator: H3.
  - Scorer: S3D.
  - Judges:
    - Slalom: 5 judges J3 or 3 judges J3 if gate video installed.
    - Tricks: 5 judges J3 or 3 judges J3 if immediate review is available.
    - Jump: 3 judges National.
- As a minimum two of the judges must be qualified for disabled skiing in all events.
- Drivers: D3 for all events.

For a combined waterski and disabled competition, the Chief Judge or Assistant Chief Judge or the Scorer must be qualified for disabled for all parts of the competition which are specifically dealing with disabled skiers.

Performances from Disabled skiers set at a Waterski competition, which meet all the requirements of a Waterski homologated competition will be considered valid for the Europe & Africa Ranking List if the homologation file and the results file have either been:

b) Technical requirements

As DAR Appendix A

### DEA1.03: Record Capability Homologation

a) Qualification of the officials

To be recognised as a Record Capability homologated competition, the jury must, as a minimum, consist of:

- Chief Judge: J2D or J2;  
If the Chief Judge is a J2, it is sufficient to appoint J2D as Assistant Chief Judge.
  - Homologator: H1 or H2.
  - Scorer: S3D.
  - Judges:
    - Slalom: 4 Level 2 judges, 1 judge J3 OR 3 Level 2 judges if gate video installed.
    - Tricks: 4 Level 2 judges, 1 judge J3 OR 3 Level 2 judges if immediate review is available.
    - Trick timer: Level 2 judge.
    - Jump: 3 Level 2 judges
- As a minimum two of the judges must be qualified for disabled skiing in all events.
- Drivers: As a minimum 2 drivers D3 for all events.

b) Technical requirements

As DAR Appendix A

### DEA1.04: Downgrading of homologation

Should a competition not meet either the requirements set out in DAR.DEA1.02 or DAR.DEA1.03 the homologation of the event will automatically be downgraded to the actual homologation level achieved.

### DEA1.05: Combined Waterski and Disabled Competitions

For a combined Waterski and disabled competition, the Chief Judge or Assistant Chief Judge or the Scorer must be qualified for disabled for all parts of the competition which are specifically dealing with disabled skiers.

Performances from Disabled skiers set at a Waterski competition, which meet all the requirements of a homologated competition will be considered valid for the Europe & Africa Ranking List if the homologation file and the results file have either been:

## Rule DEA2 - Eurotour

Where the words “EuroTour” appear in these rules they are to be understood as Disabled Tournament EuroTour.

### DEA2.01: General

- a) Any homologated competition may count towards EuroTour scoring
- b) The EuroTour is an open event
- c) The EuroTour can be included in any Open Tournament competitions

### DEA2.02: Eurotour Competitions

EuroTour is a combination of all performances of a skier across all competitions within the year. The name EuroTour can still be used for a competition.

- a) Any homologated competition except IWWF Worlds and E&A ~~Titled Championships events~~, may count as a EuroTour competition provided that:
  - The event is listed on the Europe & Africa Disabled or Tournament Calendar
  - The competition results are received and ratified by the Disabled Council and the homologation dossier is received and ratified by the Disabled Council or Waterski Council as detailed in line with DAR.DEA1.02 and DAR.DEA1.03
- b) A EuroTour competition does not need to include all 3 events.
- c) Competitions indicated as EuroTour comprising of more than one round will be regarded as one separate EuroTour competition.
- d) Within 30 days of each EuroTour compliant competition the results, competition file and homologation dossier must be published to the E&A Website. If not possible to upload, send the documents to: [eurotour.disabled@gmail.com](mailto:eurotour.disabled@gmail.com)

### DEA2.03: Rookie Slalom

- a) Rookie Slalom will be run as a separate event; for rules regarding this event see rule DAR.EA3.

### DEA2.04: Participation

- a) Any skier may attend as many EuroTour competitions as they wish.
- b) There will be no minimum entry requirement for any EuroTour competition.

### DEA2.05: Classification

- a) Any skier holding a current World or Europe & Africa classification card will ski in the category on that card in all European and African competitions in which he participates.
- b) Any V skier holding a current IBSA card, but not a current Europe & Africa or World classification card will ski in the category designated by the IBSA card in all European and African competitions in which he participates.
- c) Any skier not classified under DEA2.05 above may ski in the EuroTour as follows:
  - Skiers claiming V classification will ski as V2/3
  - Skiers claiming MP classification will ski as MP5
  - Skiers claiming A/L classification will ski as L

- Skiers claiming A1, A2, L or LP classification will ski as classified by the Chief Judge
- d) The Europe & Africa Disabled Council will provide, every World Championship year (odd years) a classification opportunity, at the last competition of the year. To be classified at this event a written request must be received by the Europe & Africa disabled council at least one month prior to that competition. The cost of this classification will be: 30 Euro per skier, to be paid by the skier to the Europe & Africa Disabled Council.

#### DEA2.06: Scoring

For **2022**, all disability categories will be ranked against one another, men and women combined.

Each competitor shall be awarded at each competition, in each event, a certain number of points according to the relationship of his score to the Europe & Africa record.

Points will be calculated as follows:

Skier's score will be multiplied by 1,000, and that figure will be divided by the Europe & Africa record of the skier's category.

#### DEA2.07: Eurotour Point System

In each EuroTour competition, the result will be based on the best overall points score of any round and in each event.

Final placement in each event will be the sum of the skier's placement overall points from all the competitions he/she skied in that.

If a tie exists after the final placement, the tied contestants will be awarded with the same placement.

#### DEA2.08: Overall

In order to receive overall points, a skier must score points in all three events at a competition.

Final placement in the overall event will be the sum of a skier's overall points from all competitions of the year.

If a tie exists after the final placement, the tied contestants will be awarded with the same placement.

#### DEA2.09: Prizes

Certificates will be awarded at the annual Congress for 1<sup>st</sup> place in each event and overall

#### DEA2.10: Officials

Officials to be provided by the Competition organiser.

Minimum qualification of officials required as Additional Rules for the Disabled: (DAR DEA1.02 and DAR.DEA1.03)

### DEA3 - Rules "Rookie Slalom"

Is a new division of Slalom, introduced to encourage novice skiers to enter a competition. It will be run as a separate event and can be used in National and Euro Tour events.

It will not be an event in the European Championships. It will be run for all categories.

Skiers will ski according to gender.

Any skier who has a score on the present or past Slalom Ranking lists will not be eligible to compete in Rookie Slalom.

When run as part of the EuroTour, it will be run under general EuroTour Rules.

The minimum starting speed for all categories will be: Men 31 Km/h and Women 28 Km/h. The maximum speeds will be: Men 58 Km/h, Women 55Km/h.

The contestant will be restricted to four passes.

The skier will select his rope length and speed for the first two passes, the chosen rope length will remain constant for both passes. He will then select his start speed and rope length for the second two passes.

The skier is required to notify the dock official of speed and rope length required for all passes prior to start.

The boat may stop after each pass, provided the skier notifies the dock official before he starts his run.

To complete a “virage” a skier is required to cross both wakes, turn and re-enter the wake from the opposite direction. Skier shall follow the tow boat through the entrance gates of the Slalom Course, ski 6 “virages” in a pendulum fashion; commencing with a “virage” from left to right, in the length of the Slalom course. He will proceed through the far end gates – this will be regarded as completing a pass. If his first pass is complete, he will then make a turn and return through the course in a similar fashion for his second pass.

On completion of 2 successful “virage” passes, skier is then required to run the next two passes on the regular Slalom course for his category.

The first two passes will be scored only in full buoys.  $\frac{1}{4}$  and  $\frac{1}{2}$  buoys will not be scored. A skier will be awarded a buoy when he crosses the line of the gate, buoys having completed a “virage”. The second two passes will be scored with full value for  $\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\frac{1}{2}$ , and full buoys. Scoring rules regarding A1, A2, L, A/L1, A/L2 and MP will not be applied.

The skier may elect to waive some passes; six points will be added to the skiers score for each pass he elects to waive, provided his first pass is perfect. If a skier misses in a pass that follows an optionally waived pass, he shall be scored as if the buoys were scored in the pass following the last completed pass, or the first pass if he did not complete any pass.

For all categories, the sequence of passes will be as follows: Start speed for Men 31 Km/h and Women 28 Km/h, speed increasing in increments of 3 Km/h to a maximum of 58 Km/h for Men and 55 Km/h for Women. On completion of a 58 Km/h or 55 Km/h pass on “virage” slalom the next pass will be 31 Km/h for Men or 28 Km/h for Women with any constant rope length (see D8.03) on “regular” Slalom course.

For scoring (for all categories), the first two passes will be scored according to the speed chosen to a max of 58 Km/h for Men or 55 Km/h for Women, the chosen rope length will not be taken into account for scoring purposes. (i.e. the maximum numbers of buoys which can be scored in the first two rounds will be 60). The second two passes will be scored with full value for  $\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\frac{1}{2}$  and full buoys. Scoring rules regarding A1, A2, L, A/L1, A/L2 and MP will not be applied.

The Emanuel Lion Scoring program will not be used for recording the score for Rookie Slalom, a simple spread sheet or other method chosen by the official scorer will suffice.

## WAREA4.4 - Registration of Homologated Competitions

WAREA4.4.02: Definition of types of competition

**Rule EA4.4.02 will apply with the following addition:**

- The Organisers shall be responsible for the cost of full board and lodging of the Appointed Officials and their transport between hotel and site. Board and lodging means from the night before an official's duties begin to and including the night of the last competition day. Any further hospitality offered by the Organisers shall apply equally to all the Appointed Officials.**  
**The Organisers shall be responsible for the cost of full board and lodging for the Classification Team and their transport between hotel and site. Board and lodging means from the night before the day of classification to and including the night of the classification day ( 2 nights)**

## Rule WAREA4.7 - Boat testing, approval

WAREA4.7.01: Boat eligibility

Any boat used for a disabled competition must be an acceptable boat for a waterski competition of the same level according to rule WAR.EA4.7.1

WAREA4.7.02: Procedures

There are no boat testing nor approval procedures which are specific for disabled skiing.



## SECTION 5 – EUROPE & AFRICA OFFICIALS

### Rule DEA5.1 - Qualification of officials for disabled skiing

#### a) Principle

In order to be considered qualified in the rules of disabled skiing it is necessary for all Judges and Scorers to pass the relevant theoretical written examination prepared by the Disabled Council.

Seminars will be organised by the Europe & Africa Disabled Council as deemed necessary.

Notice of such Seminars will be sent to all Federations prior to the event. It is strongly recommended by the Disabled Council that all candidates attend an awareness seminar prior to sitting a written examination.

#### b) Organisation

- By the Disabled Council

At least once every three years, the Disabled Council shall organise an awareness seminar.

An awareness seminar organised by the D.C. is open to all candidates who inform the D.C. of their intention to attend. The participants attend the seminar at their own cost.

- By a National Federation

National Federations may organise awareness seminars. Applications shall be made to the Europe & Africa Disabled Council.

The Disabled Council shall appoint the lecturer(s). The organising Federation shall reimburse their travelling and board and lodging expenses.

A national awareness seminar is open to all candidates. The participants attend the seminar at their own cost.

- Written Examinations

Written examinations will be organised by the Disabled Council.

#### c) List of Officials

Every year, the Disabled Council shall publish the list of the officials who are qualified in the rules for disabled skiing.

### Rule DEA5.3 - Level 1 judges for Disabled skiing

#### DEA5.3.01: General

Waterski Additional Rules WAR EA5.1 and WAR EA5.3 regarding Level 1 judges for Waterski (J1) apply to Level 1 judges for disabled skiing (J1D) reading “Disabled Council” instead of “Waterski Council”.

#### DEA5.3.02: Requirements

##### a) For Level 2 judges for disabled skiing (J2D)

A Level 2 judge for disabled skiing must pass a Level 1 theoretical examination organised by the Waterski Council (see WAR EA5.4) in order to become Level 1 judge for disabled (J1D). Candidates shall follow the administrative procedures described in rule WAR.EA5.4.

##### b) For Level 1 judges for Waterski (J1)

Any Level 1 judge for Waterski qualifies as Level 1 judge for disabled skiing while he is qualified in the rules for disabled skiing (see DAR DEA5.1a)).

- c) For Level 2 judges for Waterski (J2)

A Level 2 judge for Waterski has to pass a Level 1 theoretical examination organised by the Waterski Council (see WAR EA5.4) and be qualified in the rules for disabled skiing (see DAR EA5.1a)) in order to become Level 1 judge for disabled (J1D).

Candidates shall follow the administrative procedures described in rule WAR EA5.4

## Rule DEA5.4 - Level 2 judges for Disabled skiing

### DEA5.4.01: General

Waterski Additional Rules WAR EA5.1 and WAR EA5.4 regarding Level 2 judges for Waterski (J2) apply to Level 2 judges for disabled skiing (J2D) reading "Disabled Council" instead of "Waterski Council".

Level 2 judges for disabled skiing are qualified to judge at any level of homologated competition.

### DEA5.4.02: Requirements

- a) For Level 3 judges for disabled skiing (J3D)

A Level 3 judge for disabled skiing must pass a Level 2 theoretical examination organised by the Waterski Council (see WAR EA5.4) in order to become Level 2 judge for disabled skiing (J2D).

Candidates shall follow the administrative procedures described in rule WAR EA5.4

- b) For Level 2 judges for Waterski(J2)

Any Level 2 judge for Waterski qualifies as Level 2 judge for disabled skiing (J2D) while he is qualified in the rules for disabled skiing (see DAR EA5.1a)).

- c) For Level 3 judges for Waterski(J3)

A Level 3 judge for Waterski must pass a Level 2 theoretical examination organised by the Waterski Council (see WAR EA5.4) and to be qualified in the rules for disabled skiing (see DAR.EA5.1a)) in order to become Level 2 judge for disabled skiing (J2D).

Candidates shall follow the administrative procedures described in rule WAR EA5.4

## Rule DEA5.5 - Level 3 Judges for Disabled skiing

### DEA5.5.01: Requirements

Any Level 3 judge for Waterski qualifies as Level 3 judge for disabled skiing (J3D) while he is qualified in the rules for disabled skiing (see DAR.DEA5.1a)).

### DEA5.5.02 - Functions

Level 3 judges for disabled skiing are qualified to judge at Ranking List homologation competitions.

## Rule DEA5.6 - Homologators, Scorers and Drivers For Disabled skiing

### DEA5.6.01: Level 1 and Level 2 Homologators

Any Level 1 and 2 homologator qualified for Waterski according to WAR EA5.6 and WAR EA5.7 is automatically qualified as Level 1 and 2 homologator for disabled skiing.

### DEA5.6.02: Level 1 and Level 2 Scorers

Any Level 1 Scorer or Level 2 Scorer qualified for Waterski according to WAR EA5.8 and EA5.9 and who is qualified in the rules of disabled (see DAR DEA5.1a)) and has passed the appropriate exam is qualified as a Level 1 or Level 2 Scorer for disabled skiing.

#### DEA5.6.03: Level 1 and Level 2 Drivers

Any Level 1 Driver qualified for Waterski according to WAR EA5.10 and WAR EA5.11 is automatically qualified as a Level 1 or Level 2 Driver for disabled skiing.

#### DEA5.6.04: Level 3 Homologators, Level 3 Scorers and Level 3 Drivers

Any Level 3 homologator qualified for Waterski according to WAR EA5.13 is automatically qualified as Level 3 homologator for disabled skiing.

Any Level 3 Scorer qualified for Waterski according to WAR EA5.13 and who is qualified in the rules of disabled (see DAR EA5.1a)) and has passed the appropriate exam is qualified as Level 3 Scorer for disabled skiing.

Any Level 3 driver qualified for Waterski according to WAR EA5.13 is automatically qualified as Level 3 driver for disabled skiing.
